

The FY 2017 State budget proposed by Governor Larry Hogan and passed by the Maryland General Assembly in April included a record \$20.3 million in funding for the Maryland State Arts Council (MSAC). Approximately 16% of our budget comes from the MSAC so this will positively impact the CCAC. Be sure to thank your State delegates for their support of arts funding – indeed it is an investment with a significant return.
