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The Carroll County Arts Council’s “Thread” exhibit is now online

With the Carroll County Arts Council’s doors still closed, their previously scheduled “Thread” art exhibit has been adapted to an online catalog format. This exhibit, featuring over 20 local artists’ interpretations of what thread means to them, can be accessed at CarrollCountyArtsCouncil.org.

What do you think of when you think of thread? Is it just a long, thin strand of cotton, nylon, or other fibers? What is the thread that holds us together? How is thread made? This exhibit explores the answers to these questions and much more. “Thread” is a diverse collection of pieces that utilize a variety of mediums like quilts, photography, paintings, mixed media, and more. Each piece also features the artist’s personal story of how their work connects to the theme of thread.

"The idea behind this exhibit was how we can all interpret the same concept very differently," said CCAC Education and Visual Arts Coordinator, Moriah Tyler, "This show is very dear to my heart because it is the first exhibit that I've curated since joining the Arts Council team last fall." Not only is it Tyler's first exhibit, "Thread" is also the first Arts Council exhibit to be published as a catalog, something they hope to do more of in the future.
