Exhibits

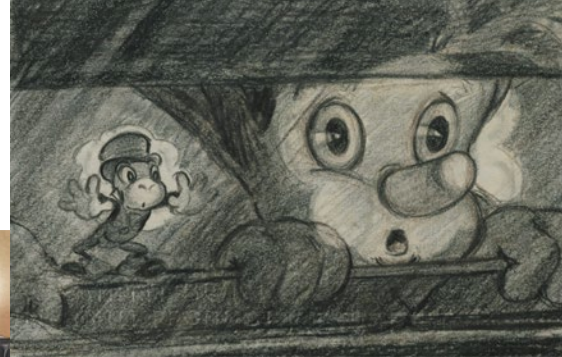
This year's gallery season was a mix of annual favorites and new, unique shows. After concurrent exhibits from the Baltimore Watercolor Society ("Aqueous Media") and local CCPS art teachers ("Adapt & Inspire"), our annual Members Show once again graced our galleries in the fall. The Members Show reception was also our farewell party for former Executive Director, Judy Morley. As always, we then finished 2021 with our annual holiday boutique, the 13th Annual Gallery of Gifts!

We were thrilled to start 2022 with "Icons of American Animation," an incredible dual-venue show curated by McDaniel professor and CCAC board member, Robert Lemieux in collaboration with our Visual Arts Coordinator, Moriah Tyler. With original concept drawings, paintings, cels, storyboards, and music sheets, the exhibit highlighted animation's cultural impact, artistic relevance, technological achievements, and historical moments in time. Thousands of visitors came through our Tevis Gallery and the Rice Gallery at McDaniel College to see over 150 pieces of animation history! The displayed pieces were part of a private collection belonging to Mike Glad, who came from his California home to attend the exhibit reception. In conjunction with the iconic animation in our Tevis Gallery, our Community Gallery was home to "Whimsy," a local artists' exhibit featuring pieces, from paintings to costumes, inspired by fictional characters and worlds.

After this year's PEEPshow wrapped up, we jumped right into the creativity from our annual Youth Art Month exhibit. We had two packed receptions full of families eager to see their budding artist's work! Our final shows of the spring were "40 x 40 @ 40," a unique traveling quilt exhibition from the Manhattan Quilters Guild in New York and our annual exhibit from the ever-talented Carroll County Artists Guild.

Art Classes

Our art education programs for youth and adults made a triumphant return this year! We had our first art summer camp in over a year with Famous Artists camp, a week-long program where mini Monets put their own spin on iconic pieces from artists of the past, including Van Gogh, Andy Warhol, and Frida Kahlo. The fall of 2021 also saw the return of Make it and Take it, our seminal youth art class.

In the spring, we welcomed new art teachers from local arts collectives. For children, we had Community of Kindness Art Sessions, a class taught by Tina Thomas and Eric Miller of the Infinite Love Project (famous for their Be Kind signs!). For adults, Jeff Sharp of the 5x7 Underground collective led a Sketchbook Workshop that taught students a variety of sketching techniques.

Concerts, Theatre, & Dance

This season, our theatre finally had its first regular full schedule of live programming since 2020! We kicked off the fall with a few familiar crowd-favorites: The Eric Byrd Trio, The Fabulous Hubcaps (our first sold out show of the year!), and Shenandoah Run. In November, we welcomed a new face to our stage: acclaimed D.C. jazz singer, Sharón Clark, delivering a fantastic concert. As always, our holiday programming was a hit with families. They enjoyed the swinging sounds of the Carroll County Sunday Night Big Band and filled the theatre for three near-sold out performances of the Eric Byrd Trio's "A Charlie Brown Jazz Christmas."

The new year began with a variety of live theatre performances including *A Raisin in the Sun* from the National Players and two children's programs, *Aesop's Fables* and *Freedom Songs*, from Bright Star Touring Theatre. On the live music and dance front, audiences were thrilled this spring by a variety of acts. From the unique stringed sounds of the Baltimore Mandolin Orchestra, to Celtic rock from Gaelic Mishap, to the thunderous choreography of the Teelin Irish Dance Company, and the colorful Eastern European folk traditions of the Kalinka Dance Ensemble, there was something for everyone to enjoy.

Last May, our stage once again hosted The Sagamore Band, a classic rock cover group that always gets audiences on their feet. We also held our first Pay-What-You-Can family show on Memorial Day with "Axé Puro: Folkloric Music & Dance from Brazil" a revue from Afro-Brazilian ensemble, Ologundê. Closing out the season with a bang was piano virtuoso and son of Jim, A.J. Croce! His impressive talent and unmatched storytelling made it a memorable evening for over 200 theatregoers.

Besides presenting dynamic talent from around the region, our theater also held a number of performance series from local groups throughout the year. We hosted Third Wednesday Jazz from the Leister Quartet, improv shows from Memory Lane Playback Theatre, and chamber music from the Opus Community Music School.

Children's Theatre

Our youth theater programs also made a comeback this season. For the first time since the shutdown, our Children's Theatre Troupe performed in person (but fully masked)! The troupe's local middle school performers presented "Schoolhouse Rock, Jr.," a musical revue inspired by the classic educational cartoon series. The kids were thrilled to be back onstage!

In 2021, we also offered a weeklong Theatre Summer Camp program that gave aspiring thespians the opportunity to write, block, and perform their own original plays. Throughout the 21/22 school year, we also offered multiple sessions of our weekly youth theatre class, Take the Stage.

24th Annual Festival of Wreaths

Nov 26 - Dec 5, 2021

The 2021 Festival of Wreaths was full of holiday cheer! While we welcomed many more visitors this year than in 2020, the bidding for this silent auction retained its online format. It has made the auction process just too smooth to go back! Featuring over 100 handmade wreaths, the Arts Council raised \$13,734 from this beloved holiday event



PEEPshow

April 8 - 18, 2022

It was our second year holding our most popular event off-site at the TownMall of Westminster. Over ten days, we welcomed thousands of visitors from all over the region to marvel at the marshmallow masterpieces. Our Grand Prize winner was "Something's Wrong with That Boy's Medulla Oblongata" by Christian Twamley! His 7-foot sculpture of Foghorn Leghorn was certainly worthy of the achievement. Thanks to the generosity of our peeps, the Arts Council raised a total of \$66,685.

Art in the Park

June 4, 2021

Our annual free arts and crafts festival on the grounds of Westminster City Hall was another stellar success! We had over 50 local artisans, live music, and hundreds of shoppers.

1st Annual Juneteenth in Carroll

June 18, 2022

Earlier this summer, Downtown Westminster hosted the first-ever Juneteenth celebration in Carroll County! In partnership with the Juneteenth in Carroll Planning Committee, the CCAC helped host a number of programs both inside the Arts Center and in our surrounding outdoor areas including panel discussions, live performances, and a number of community and food vendors.

Films

FLICC

(Film Lovers in Carroll County)

FLICC returned to their regular movie-screening schedule this season! Over 130 people attended their July 2021 screening of *Jaws*, complemented by blue slushies mixed with shark gummies from our concession stand. In the fall, they also hosted a free educational screening of the 2021 Academy Award winner for Best Documentary, *My Octopus Teacher*. In the new year, their annual January Documentary Series and Foreign Film Festival returned in person for the first time since 2020! The most popular doc of the series was *Muscle Shoals*, a rockumentary about the rise of FAME Studios, the legendary recording home of artists like Aretha Franklin, Lynyrd Skynyrd, and Percy Sledge. For the Foreign Film Festival, most movie-lovers flocked to feel-good British comedy, *Fisherman's Friends*.

Special Film Events

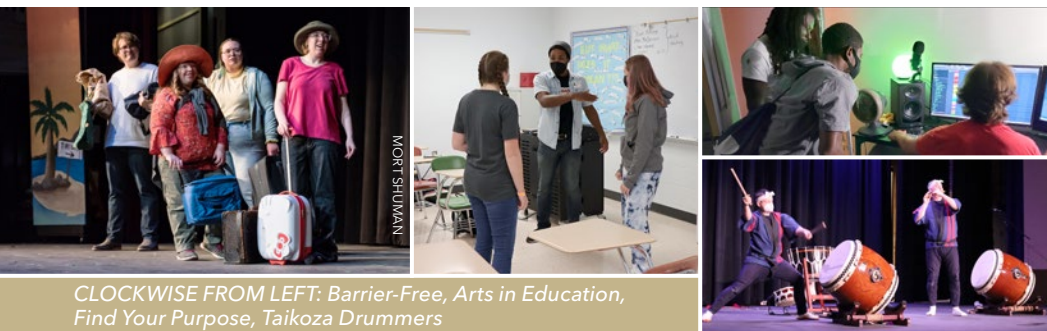
To the delight of busy parents, our Free Summer Movie series returned to our theatre last year with four family-friendly films. We also introduced a brand new horror film series, *Scary Tale Endings*, last October. It was a week of nightly horror classics all leading up to our annual late-night showing of *The Rocky Horror Picture Show*! Our theatre was packed with almost 200 creatures of the night at this year's *Rocky Horror* screening.

In light of this year's tragic invasion of Ukraine, we held a free screening of *Orange Revolution*, a 2007 documentary detailing the titular movement that took place after Ukraine's fraudulent 2004 presidential election. McDaniel College professor of Comparative Politics, Dr. Christianna Nichols Leahy, led a post-film talk back that helped further educate the audience how the film provides vital background to the perplexing and heartbreaking war in Ukraine today. We plan to do more events that help educate our community about current events in the future.

Scholarships

• Tevis College Arts Scholarship

Seniors from our local Carroll County high schools are awarded \$1,000 to pursue an arts major in college. These scholarships are awarded in memory of Dorothy Tevis, a devoted patron of the arts in Carroll County, and are continually made possible thanks to the generosity of Peggy Tevis.

– 7 scholarships totaling \$7,000 total

– The Class of 2022 recipients are pursuing majors in Fine Arts & Visual Design, Architecture, Illustration, Stage Management, Art Education, Cinema & Photography, and Computer Graphics

• Tom Holder Scholarships

Students in need can receive free or reduced tuition for CCAC education programs.

– A total of \$385.61 was awarded to four local youth to participate in our classes and camps.

Grants

• Community Arts Development (CAD) Grants

Large grants that either support the general operations of local arts organizations or help non-arts organizations complete arts-related projects.

– 12 grants totaling \$60,000

– One of this year's CAD grants supported Barrier-Free, a nonprofit from Sykesville that provides inclusive art, theatre, self-advocacy, and social programming for adults with disabilities in the community.

• Arts in Education Grants

These grants funded through the Maryland State Arts Council help bring Maryland artists and performers into public schools for residencies, workshops, assembly performances, etc.

– 1 grant totaling \$500 brought Chesapeake Shakespeare Company teaching artists from Baltimore to Francis Scott Key and South Carroll high schools for special sessions with English and drama students.

– Additional funds brought two special free performances to our stage from cultural education acts, the Taikoza Drummers and Ologundê.

• Mini-Grants

Small grants that support specific arts projects for both arts and non-arts organizations.

– 7 grants totaling \$5,577.50

– A new Mini Grant recipient this year was Find Your Purpose, a nonprofit that “aspires to elevate and empower individuals of all ages through mentorship, experiential learning, and entrepreneurship opportunities.” Their grant funds went towards securing equipment and educators for their youth education programs in fields like photography, music production, videography, and more.

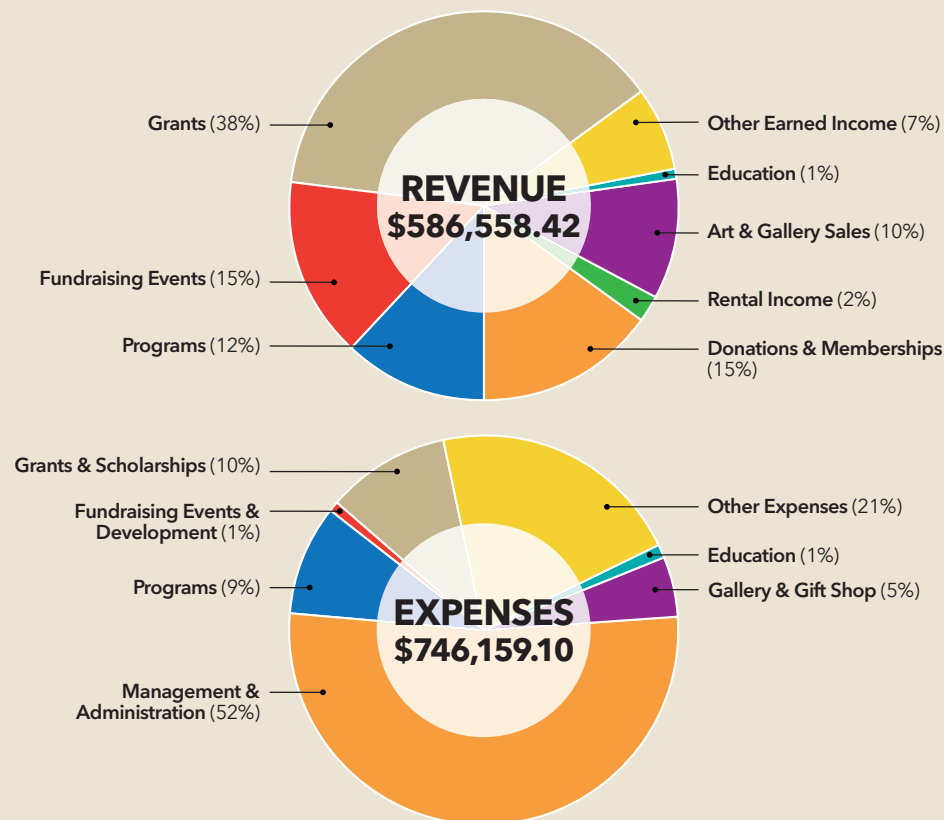

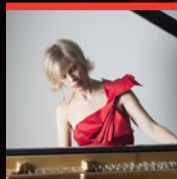
